
## Morning Star Ministries Update May 2017

This is a bittersweet testimony. Kirandeep was born with major heart and lung defects which made it difficult for her to breathe and doctors didn't think she would make it into teenage years. Her parents brought her to us six years ago when she was 13. We prayed and consulted the best cardio-thoracic specialists but all of them told us there was nothing that could be done for her medically or surgically. One top specialist told us privately that he thought she wouldn't live for longer than six months. So, we carried on praying and Kirandeep and her Mother became committed Christians. Kirandeep was very intelligent and continued her education passing her GCSEs with good marks. As there is no school or college in our village where she could study for 'A' levels her Mother asked us if we might help. We agreed to employ an extra teacher so that Kirandeep could study for 'A' levels with us at Morning Star School. Sadly Kirandeep's condition gradually deteriorated and on April 9<sup>th</sup>, just a few days after taking her final 'A' level paper, she went to be with Jesus forever. April 9<sup>th</sup> was Palm Sunday and we feel it's as if the Lord himself held

out a palm branch to his precious daughter Kirandeep on that day and ushered her into His presence where there is no more pain, suffering or tears .Truly ,she fought a good fight, she lived

a courageous life, never giving in to the despairing medical opinions or her failing health, and of course she passed her 'A' levels but more than that, she passed life's great test and now she is at rest. Her Mum told me that her daughter taught her how to live bravely and to make the most of every day. We shall never forget Kirandeep and the wonderful example she gave of suffering adversity bravely and with great dignity.

## New Shool Staff and Infrastructure.



We have employed new security and cleaning staff for the safety and maintenance of the new school building and have had water softening, filtering and cooling systems installed.





Before moving the children into the new building we want to have adequate competent staff in place to give the children the care and attention they need. We have been praying for dedicated helpers to join us as residential workers and currently we have two young Christian families living and working with us for a trial period and things are looking positive.



Mattay and Savita are from Marharastra (where Mumbai is) so their mother tongue is Maharati, the same as the majority of our children (this is spoken in their family homes but they are educated in Punjabi, Hindi and English) and they have experience in pastoral and teaching work, leading worship and many practical skills. They have two small children of their own (Arav and Sophia) and have quickly developed a loving connection with our children.



Mark and Vydia are from central India and they also have two children (Rachel and Ruben). Mark was orphaned at 7 days old, he was brought up in a children's home and has since worked in a children's home as well as other ministry settings. He is a good Bible teacher and has a quiet gentleness about him. He and his wife are hard workers and have many practical skills. Please pray that we and these two families will know definitely, from the Lord, if it His will for them to work with us on a long term basis.

Please also pray that, with the Lord's help, we would find a suitable cook/catering manager to run our large kitchen. Someone who understands budgeting, stock control, personnel management and nutrition. Good nutrition is so vital if our children are to reach their potential, especially when so many have suffered from malnutrition in early life.

in June we are hopeful all things should be ready to move the school, the girls, and our younger boys into the new building, while the older boys will continue to live in the church.
