replacement in Raksha, a nurse who came to spend Jan/Feb with us while on furlough from a mission hospital. She taught Mani's classes, administered healthcare to our children, took assemblies, taught bible stories and shared her life with us. Before she left Raksha told us that she had received much more than she has given. That she could see clearly that our children had "tasted that the Lord is good" and that they all know God's love deep in their hearts. In her spiritual life she said that during her time with us she learned many things, chiefly that it is more blessed to give than to receive. ©
